PEDAL POWER

Cycling is quickly becoming a popular form of transport in many cities around the world. Apart from being better for the environment than cars, bicycles are a great way to avoid traffic jams and the problems of parking.

To encourage more people to use bicycles, many cities are introducing bike-hire schemes that allow cyclists to collect a bike from a cycle stand and then leave it at another stand near their destination. The latest city to join the cycle craze is London, where a 10-year plan has been announced to introduce cycle zones and stands, where thousands of bicycles will be available for hire. But the UK cycling craze isn't limited to London. A scheme funded by the national lottery is also creating new cycling and walking routes across the whole of the country. Those behind the scheme want walking and cycling to become the easiest way for people to go to work, to the shops and to school.

At the moment, 90% of school kids in Britain have got a bike, and more than 30% want to cycle to school, but only 1% do. Many parents think that cycling is dangerous and prefer to take their kids to school by car. In the USA, things aren't much better. Fewer than 15% of American kids cycle or walk to school. Another problem is vandalism and theft. As more people use bicycles, more bicycles are being stolen. In most of the cities that offer bikes for hire, the bicycles have a distinctive design and colour to make them more difficult to steal.

Introducing bicycles as a form of transport in cities can take time. Motorists have to get used to cyclists on the roads, and pedestrians have to learn to share pavements with them. But there is no doubt that pedal power is becoming the best way to get around a city on wheels.
